105	Assessment Answer Key: Assessment 4: Pronouns and Antecedents (Lesson 10): Section D	<p>Error: The answer to Section D was incorrect. In the second sentence of the paragraph, “dancing” was not indicated as an antecedent. In the third sentence of the paragraph, “it” was not indicated as a pronoun. The incorrect answer was the following:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">{Jacob and Josiah} are twins! <u>They</u> both enjoy dancing. <u>They</u> are good at it! {Jacob} likes to dance ballet. {Josiah} likes to dance hip hop. <u>They</u> go to a dance studio almost every day. The {teachers} think <u>they</u> are talented. <u>They</u> want {Jacob and Josiah} to go to dance school someday. {Jacob and Josiah} are excited for the future!</p> <p>Correction: In the answer for Section D, “dancing” has been indicated as an antecedent, and “it” has been indicated as a pronoun.
