43	Answer Key: Nonfiction Unit: Roughing It: Chapter XLII: Day 4: Analyzing Literary Elements	Update: In the “Roughing It: Chapter XLII” Day 4 section, the answer to Analyzing Literary Elements question #1 was corrected to “In <i>Roughing It</i> , Mark Twain tells his story in first-person point-of-view. The use of first-person contributes to the audience’s understanding of Twain’s thoughts and feelings as he moves from job to job, trying out many professions. For instance, after he has failed in a number of career attempts, Twain states “I sat down, in the cabin, and gave myself up to solid misery.” Because it’s written in first person, Twain relays not only important events but also his emotional response to it.”
